

## ICELAND

### Required Documents (for most visa categories):

When applying for an **Iceland visa** through the **Norwegian Embassy in Jordan** (since Iceland is a Schengen country and Norway processes visa applications for Iceland), the **required documents** will generally be the same for most visa categories, with some variations depending on the type of visa you're applying for (e.g., short-stay Schengen visa, long-stay national visa, transit visa). Below are the **common documents** required for **Iceland visa applications**:

#### 1. General Required Documents for Most Visa Categories:

##### 1. Completed Visa Application Form:

- The visa application form must be fully filled out and signed.
- The application form must be filled out **accurately** and **truthfully**.

##### 2. Valid Passport:

- Your passport must be **valid for at least 3 months beyond your planned departure** from Iceland.
- If you have old passports, provide copies of the previous ones with **Schengen visas** (if applicable).

##### 3. Passport-sized Photos:

- **Two recent passport-sized photos** (35mm x 45mm) that meet the Schengen photo specifications.
- The photo should have a **white background**, with a neutral facial expression.

##### 4. Proof of Travel Insurance:

- You must provide **proof of travel medical insurance** that is valid for the entire duration of your stay in the Schengen Area, including Iceland.
- The insurance should cover **€30,000 for medical emergencies, repatriation, and urgent medical treatment**.

- Make sure that the insurance meets the **Schengen visa requirements**.

## 5. Flight Reservation/Travel Itinerary:

- Provide a **confirmed flight reservation**

## 6. Proof of Accommodation:

Provide evidence of your accommodation for the entire duration of your

- stay in Iceland. This can include:
  - **Hotel bookings or hostel reservations.**
  - **Invitation letter** from a host in Iceland (if visiting friends or family), with a copy of their ID or residence permit.
  - If staying with a host, the **host's address, contact details, and relationship to you** must be specified.

## 7. Proof of Sufficient Financial Means:

- You need to prove that you have enough financial means to support yourself during your stay in Iceland. This can include:
  - **Bank statements** from the last **3 months** showing sufficient funds.
  - **Payslips** from the last **3 months**.
  - A **sponsorship letter** (if someone else is financially supporting you), along with their **financial documents**.

## 8. Visa Fee Payment:

- Pay the **visa application fee** (usually **€90** for adults applying for a short-stay visa). The fee can vary depending on the visa category, and there may be reduced fees for children or specific visa types.

## 2. Additional Documents Based on Visa Type:

### For Schengen Short-Stay Visa (Type C):

- Travel itinerary:** A detailed plan of your travels within Iceland and/or
- other Schengen countries (if applicable).
  - **Invitation Letter** (for Family/Friends visits): If you're visiting family or friends, an **invitation letter** from the host in Iceland may be required. The host should include their name, address, contact details, and proof of their status in Iceland (e.g., a copy of their Icelandic passport or residence permit).

#### **For Long-Stay Visa (Type D):**

- **Acceptance Letter** (for students): An official letter from a recognized Icelandic educational institution confirming your admission to study in Iceland.
- **Work Contract** (for workers): A signed work contract or job offer letter from your employer in Iceland.
- **Proof of Accommodation:** A rental agreement or proof of where you will be staying for the duration of your stay in Iceland.
- **Proof of Relationship** (for Family Reunification): If you are applying for family reunification, you will need to provide documents proving your relationship to the family member residing in Iceland (e.g., marriage certificate, birth certificate).

#### **For Transit Visa (Type B):**

- **Visa for Final Destination:** If you are transiting through Iceland to another country, provide proof of your visa for the **final destination** country (if required).
- **Onward Travel Booking:** A confirmed booking for your onward flight or travel from Iceland to the next destination.

#### **For Airport Transit Visa (Type A):**

- **Flight Tickets:** Evidence of onward travel (e.g., flight ticket to your final destination).
- **Visa for Final Destination:** If applicable, provide the required visa for the country you're traveling to after Iceland.

### 3. Special Requirements for Specific Applicants:

- **Minors (under 18):** If you are applying on behalf of a minor, you will need to submit a **parental consent letter** from both parents or legal guardians, along with copies of their passports or national IDs.
- **Previous Schengen Visa History:** If you have previously traveled to the Schengen Area, provide details and copies of any **previous visas**.
- **Additional Documents for Specific Cases:** Depending on your circumstances (e.g., business visits, research), additional supporting documents may be required

### General Application Process for Iceland Visas:

The **general application process** for an **Iceland visa** from the **Norwegian Embassy in Jordan** is quite similar to the process for applying for a Schengen visa, as Iceland is part of the Schengen Area and the Norwegian Embassy processes Icelandic visa applications for residents of Jordan. Here's a step-by-step guide on the application process:

#### 1. Determine the Type of Visa You Need

- **Schengen Visa (Type C):** For short stays of up to **90 days** for tourism, business, or family visits.
- **National Visa (Type D):** For long stays (over 90 days), including study, work, or family reunification.
- **Transit Visa (Type B):** For travelers passing through Iceland en route to a third country.
- **Airport Transit Visa (Type A):** For travelers who will stay in the international transit area of an Icelandic airport without entering the country.

#### 2. Prepare the Required Documents

- **Collect all the necessary documents** based on the visa type you are applying for. Common documents include:
  - **Completed visa application form.**
  - **Valid passport** (with at least 2 blank pages).
  - **Passport-sized photos** (as per Schengen requirements).
  - **Travel insurance** (covering €30,000 for medical emergencies).
  - **Flight reservation** or travel itinerary.
  - **Accommodation details** for your stay in Iceland.
  - **Proof of financial means** (bank statements, payslips).
  - **Visa fee** payment receipt.

For long-stay visas, additional documents such as **acceptance letters** for students or **work contracts** for employees may be required.

### 3. Complete the Visa Application Form

- Fill out the form **accurately** and ensure it is signed.
- If applying for a **long-stay visa (Type D)**, ensure to fill out additional required forms related to your specific visa category (e.g., work, study).

### 4. Book an Appointment

- **Schedule an appointment** to submit your application. You can make an appointment either:
  - **Via the VFS Global** center in Jordan
  - You may be required to schedule an appointment online through the **VFS Global** website (if applicable). It's advisable to book an appointment at least **3-4 weeks before** your planned departure date.

## 5. Submit Your Application and Biometrics

Attend your appointment and submit your **visa application** along with

- the **required documents**.
- **Biometric data** (fingerprints and photographs) will be collected as part of the visa application process .
- Ensure that your **documents** are complete and correctly formatted before submission.

## 6. Pay the Visa Fee

- Pay the **visa application fee** when you submit your application. The fee is generally:
  - **€90** for adults (Schengen short-stay visa).
  - Fees may be reduced for children or specific visa types.

## 7. Wait for Visa Processing

- After submitting your application, your visa will go through a processing period. Generally, processing takes around **15 calendar days** for a **short-stay Schengen visa**.
- For **long-stay visas**, processing may take longer, so it's advisable to apply at least **2-3 months** before your intended travel date.

## 8. Track Your Application

- If you applied through **VFS Global**, you may be able to **track your application status** online.
- The embassy or application center will notify you once your visa is ready for collection.

## 9. Collect Your Visa

- - Once your visa is approved, you will be notified to **collect your passport** with the affixed visa.
    - You can collect it from the **VFS Global** center
  - If the visa is granted, check that the details on the visa sticker (e.g., dates, personal information) are correct.

## 9. Travel to Iceland

- Once you receive your visa, you can travel to Iceland within the visa's validity period.
- Be sure to carry any supporting documents (e.g., financial proof, accommodation details) as border control officers may request them upon arrival.
